Combination Hunt



#### Overview

We are proud to be able to bring you this incredibly exciting moose hunt in Swedish Lapland. Moose hunting is perhaps the form of hunting Sweden is most famous for, and every autumn many foreign hunters flock to Sweden to join a moose hunt and experience its excitement in the enchanting northern forests. Most of them however will take part in a driven hunt together with many local hunters. On such a hunt the likelihood of actually shooting a moose is not very high.

Many hunters dream of getting the chance of shooting a big bull moose - and no matter what, it is an unforgettable experience to have any moose in the sights of your rifle, whether it is a bull, cow or even "just" a calf.

This tour is ideal for anyone who wants to experience a "real hunt". You will hunt in the transitional manner, just as it has been done for genertions. It is a unique experience, in a beautiful landscape that will linger long in your memory. The hunting takes place on 4,500 hectares of uninterrupted terrain, west of the town of Gällivare in northern Lapland. The hunting district also borders a number of nature reserves and partially lies in Laponia, a Swedish World Heritage Site.

Once in a while, once you have shot your moose, it is necessary to call on a little extra help to move it. Today, this help comes in the form of a six wheeled ATV, which can deal with any type of terrain. In addition to hunting moose, you should have plenty of opportunities for rough shooting and fishing during your week hunting in Lapland.

The hunting team will include both dog handlers and experienced hunting dogs, who can be relied upon to do a great job. In the hunting district it is possible to find grouse, black grouse, hazel grouse and capercaillie, so you are guaranteed some exciting shooting. If you are interested in fishing you can catch grayling, brown trout, perch and pike in the lakes and streams that are within walking district of your camp, a boat is also available.

The hunting district is privately owned, and no other hunting for moose or rough shooting takes place here other than the family's own private hunts. Hunts on which the moose are "called-up" take place during the period form 20th September to 15th October, which if the high season for this form of hunting. Lying in wait is another form of hunting used. If you dream of walking with the dog handlers, you will to have a high level of fitness, as it involves walking many kilometers over hilly terrain. Moose hunting opens on September 1st and ends on November 11th, but we recommend that you don't plan to come here after October 15th. The hunting district is, after all, 100km north of the Arctic Circle and you can risk encountering temperatures of minus 15 - 20 degrees celcius.

#### **Itinerary**

**Day 1:** Arrival in Kiruna and transfer to the hunting camp. If the times allow, we will visit the local range to "shoot-in" your rifles. The afternoon and evening offers a chance to socialise, enjoy dinner, and be briefed on the coming days hunting, safety procedures etc.

**Days 2 - 6:** Hunting as described. Lunch prepared in the forest over an open fire. Dinner and sauna in the cabin during the evening. If you hunt a different part of the district, you should also be prepared to change accommodation.

**Day 7:** After breakfast you will be driven back to Kiruna to begin your journey home.









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During the hunt accommodation will be provided in a private wilderness camp, located close to the hunting district. The camp is also close to two lakes Nietsakjaute and Torislompolo. The camp consists of timber cabins, 15, 18 and 45m2 in size. Staying in camp in these relatively simple cabin is a big part of your wilderness adventure. The cabins have no electricity or running water. Despite the camp's fantastic setting it is actually only a 15 minute drive from the center of Gällivare where you can find both shops and restaurants.

The largest cabin, of 45m2, has four beds, a wood burning stove and self catering facilities. There is a kitchen and a sitting room. There is enough space for the whole group to relax and socialise together. The two smaller cabins are primarily sleeping cabins.

Our hunters fly to the city of Kiruna via Stockholm. Here our partners will welcome you and provide transfers to the camp and the hunting district.

Alternatively, if you would rather not stay in the simple wilderness camp and would prefer a little more comfort, it is possible to stay

in a hotel in nearby town of Gällivare (on payment of a supplement).









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You can now experience the thrill of a traditional moose hunt with hunting dogs in some fantastic districts north of the Polar Circle. The terrain is typical of northern Scandinavia with birch and pine forests and areas of open heather.

For a group of 2 -4 hunters the hunt will be carried out in the following manner; 1 -2 of the hunters will go out with their own dog handlers while the remaining hunter will sit at a "pass". A number of different breeds of dogs are used: the Karelian Bear Dog, Norwegian Elk Hound and West Siberian Laika, all three breeds are incredibly skilled driving dogs, and are a big part of this very special form of hunting that can only be experienced in very few places. A third form of hunting is often used during the rutting season. You guide will attempt to "call-up" the moose and it is fascinating to experience how close you can call the moose to you. During the hunt participants will thus alternate between walking with the dogs and sitting at a "pass".

This means that even if you are not in peak physical shape, you will still be able to take full advantage of the hunt. We are in no doubt about the fact that combing walking with dogs and lying in

wait in the right places will bring you into contact with as many moose as possible in the hunting district.

And remember you will not be participating in a large Swedish hunting party, but in an exclusive hunt only for our guests - eg. in a group of 4 hunters.
