# Brown bear hunt at Kodiak Island



## Overview

### Katmai Guide Service

Katmai Guide Service offers fully guided hunts on federally permitted lands for brown bear, mountain goat, and Sitka black-tailed deer on Kodiak Island. They also offer brown bear and moose hunts in the Becharof National Wildlife Refuge, located along the southern boundary of Katmai National Park, as well as in the Aniakchak National Monument and the Meshik River Valley on the Alaska Peninsula.

### The Hunt

A Kodiak brown bear hunt begins with your arrival in the city of Kodiak on Kodiak Island. The outfitter will meet hunters at the airport and assist with obtaining all necessary permits and hunting licenses. Afterward, there is an opportunity to visit local hunting and outdoor stores to purchase any additional equipment that may be needed during the hunt. Most hunters spend their first night at a hotel in Kodiak before flying out to the hunting camp the following morning.

Upon arrival at camp, hunters receive a detailed briefing on the upcoming days of hunting and are assigned their hunting guide. Most hunts are conducted with two guides per hunter. The camp is located just 100 meters from the shoreline, and the main camp consists of traditional Kodiak-style double-wall tents and WeatherPort tents, all equipped with diesel or propane heaters, generator-powered electricity, and comfortable beds. The camp offers a high level of comfort, and guests are served excellent meals, much of which consists of fresh seafood caught locally.

Transportation during the hunt is provided by 18–24-foot motorboats as well as smaller jet boats, allowing access to remote bays, rivers, and streams. Each morning begins early with a hearty breakfast before heading out by boat to one of the area's many bays. From there, hunters hike to elevated vantage points where they can glass large areas and locate bears at considerable distances.

Bears are frequently spotted from the boats while traveling between bays, and if conditions are favorable, hunters may go ashore and begin a stalk immediately. Once a mature trophy bear has been located, a careful plan is made to approach within shooting range. Large boars are exceptionally intelligent and can be extremely challenging to hunt. Their sense of smell is extraordinary, and they possess excellent eyesight and hearing. Many factors must come together for a successful stalk, making patience one of the most important keys to success.

Like all great hunting adventures, brown bear hunting requires patience, determination, and a willingness to work hard in all weather conditions. Hunters must be prepared to spend countless hours glassing vast landscapes alongside their guides, often in challenging weather, in search of the right bear.

After a long day in the field, hunters return to the main camp, usually after dark, where a hearty dinner and a comfortable night's rest await. These evenings provide the perfect opportunity to relax, share the day's experiences, and prepare for the next day's hunt.

Depending on conditions and the location of game, hunters may also spend nights in satellite camps situated in remote bays or valleys. These camps can offer a significant advantage compared to relying solely on boats, particularly when a large bear has been located in a specific area or when access is needed to terrain that cannot be reached by water. By staying closer to the hunting grounds, hunters can maximize their opportunities and increase their

chances of success. In the satellite camps, each hunter has their own tent, providing both privacy and comfort in the wilderness.

### Spring and Fall Hunts

The outfitter utilizes the same camps and hunting areas during both the spring and fall seasons. The primary difference between the two lies in bear behavior.

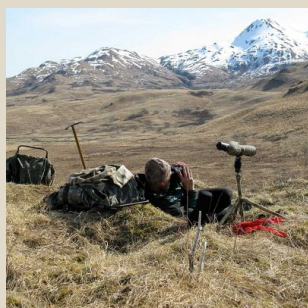
During the spring, hunters focus on bears emerging from their winter dens. Guides often search for tracks in the snow and spend considerable time locating mature boars that are actively searching for sows during the breeding season. At this time of year, bears are frequently found along the coastline feeding on kelp, washed-up carcasses, and other food sources exposed after winter.

In the fall, bears concentrate around rivers and streams where salmon runs are in full swing. They spend their days feeding heavily on salmon, roots, and berries as they prepare for the long winter ahead. While a bear's primary objective in spring is reproduction, its main focus during autumn is building sufficient fat reserves to survive hibernation.

The success rate for harvesting mature trophy bears is equally high during both seasons.

The experience of taking a large Kodiak brown bear is difficult to describe—it simply has to be experienced firsthand. Kodiak Island offers breathtaking scenery and extraordinary wildlife. Its rich marine ecosystem includes whales of many species, porpoises, seals, sea lions, and countless seabirds, all of which can be observed regularly throughout the hunt. Combined with crystal-clear blue waters and dramatic coastal landscapes, the setting is every bit as memorable as the hunt itself.

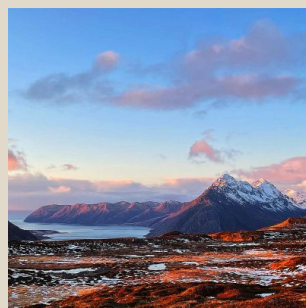
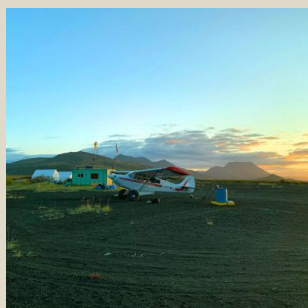
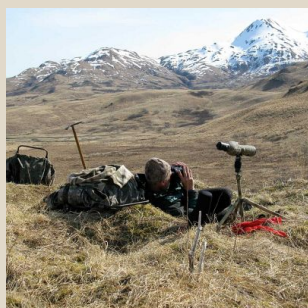

## ACCOMMODATION Kodiak camp / Bjørnejagt



Campen er beliggende kun 100 meter fra havet, og hovedlejren består af traditionelle Kodiak-style dobbeltvæggede telte og Weatherport-telte, som alle har diesel- eller propanvarmere, genereret elektricitet og komfortable senge. Lejren er meget komfortabel, og der bliver serveret førsteklasses mad, meget af det er friskfanget fra havet!

Det er også muligt at man overnatter i satellit-camps i de forskellige bugter eller dale. Dette kan give en kæmpe fordel i forhold til blot at bruge båden, især hvis du ved, at der er en stor bjørn i et bestemt område, eller hvis du vil have adgang til andre dele af området, hvor man ikke kan komme med båden. På denne måde kan man forøge sine chancer for at få en bjørn. I satellit campen vil man have sit eget telt at sove i.

Brunbjørnejagterne på Kodiak Island finder sted på Kodiak National Wildlife Refuge land, hvor outfitteren har eksklusive jagttrettigheder og er den eneste outfitter som må guide jægere i disse områder. Der tillades normalt kun 3 jægere om foråret og 3 jægere om efteråret. De fleste bjørne der nedlægges, ligger størrelsesmæssigt omkring 9 – 9½ fod, men der findes rigtig gode muligheder for at nedlægge bjørne på 10 fod eller større!

Kodiak Island har konsekvent leveret nogle af de største brunbjørne i verden, med trofæstørrelser som ligger øverst i den amerikanske Boone & Crocket Record Books. Brunbjørnebestanden på Kodiak Island er rigtig god, og man kan forvente at se mange store bjørne. At have muligheden for at jage en af ??disse unikke bjørne er virkelig toppen af

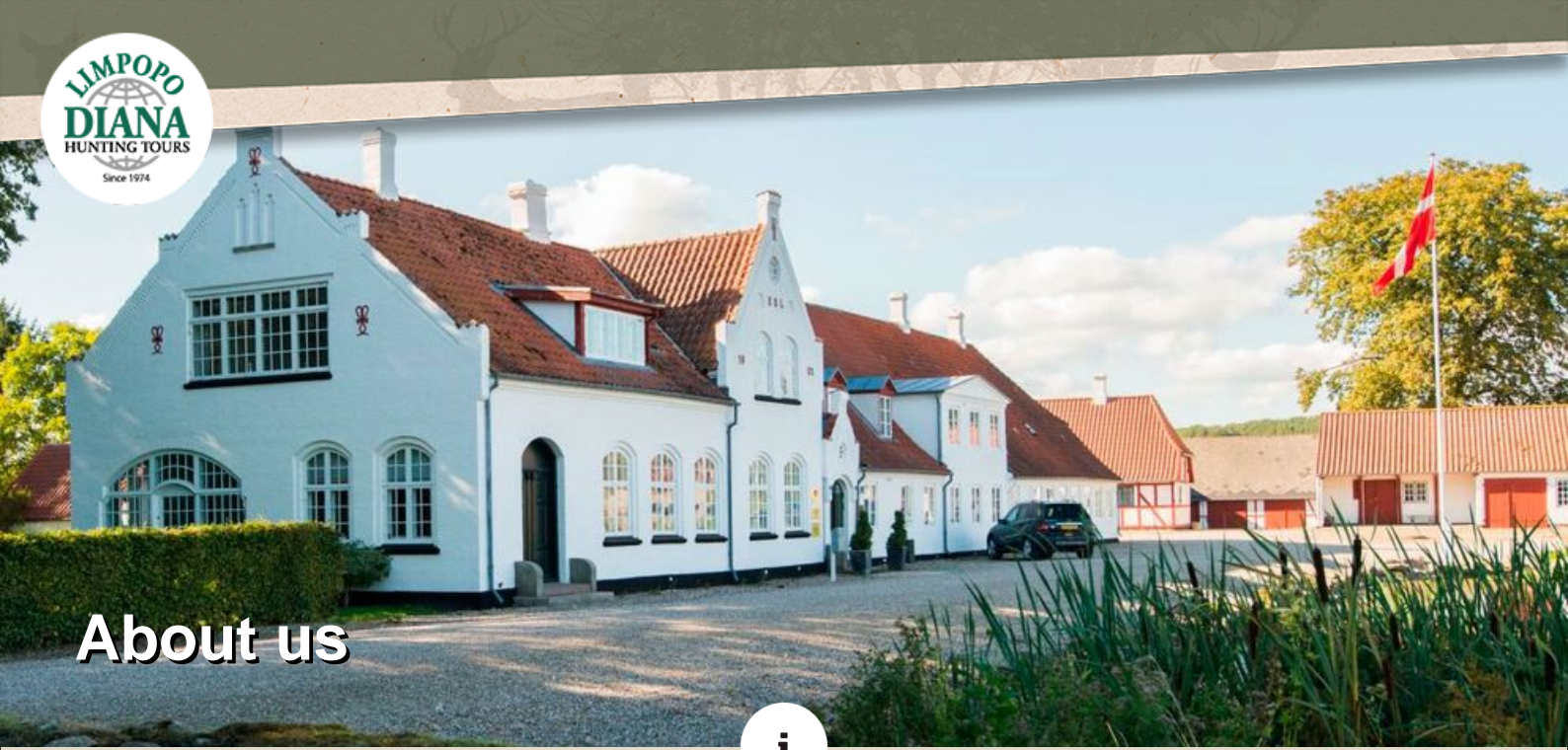
