

Overview

The Pyrenees in the southern France offers a terrific mountain hunt for chamois! We have had many hunters on Chamois hunts and there are reports of really good game management, hunting, organization, trophy quality and game populations, and when you can also treat yourself to a lot of delicious specialties from French cuisine, this kind of hunting doesn't get much better .

Hunting area in the Pyrenees

You hunt in the same mountainous areas that mouflons are hunted in. The areas are extremely hilly and require a certain physical fitness to get the best conditions for a successful hunt. We have different areas at our disposal and regardless of whether you are in one area or the other, you are hunting in extremely beautiful mountain terrain in the Pyrenees.

An Ideal Hunting Destination for the Whole Family

This is an extremely charming part of France, and even any non-hunters in your family will find lots of exciting attractions here. In addition to the hunting there is plenty of interest to see in this part of France. Where the country is at its "narrowest", it is only about 200km between the Atlantic Ocean and the Mediterranean Sea. There are many exciting old towns and castles, such as the city of Toulouse, the famous pilgrimage center of Lourdes, the historic town of Pau and the tiny country of Andorra close by. this region is worth a trip in itself. If you would like to spend a few more days here exploring this part of France, especially if you are bringing the family along, we recommend that you rent a car here.

The hunt

The Chamois in the Pyrenees are typically found some way up in the mountains, and you can expect to hunt at an altitude of 500 meters and up to 2500 meters. The hunting pressure in the various areas is minimal, which can also be seen in the trophies that are taken each year. Only older chamois are shot and the chance for a big one s extremely good.

The best hunting period is during the rut, which extends from mid/late October to end-November.

Rental rifle

It is possible to rent a rifle from our French partner. He offers, among other things, Blaser R8 prof. success in caliber 30.06 with a quality binocular from Zeiss. If you want to bring your own rifle, you must be aware that our partner requires you to shoot with a silencer.

Flights

The simplest is to fly to Toulouse, and here you can either rent a car or we can organize a transfer to the hunting grounds. We are of course happy to help you book the flight.

During your hunt you will stay in a small hotel/guest house close to the hunting district. We use a number of different establishments, but generally speaking they are all very charming, often in equipped with modern facilities such as delightful rooms, with private bath and toilet, common sitting areas, wifi, and some even have a swimming pool. Do not expect to loose weight here. Normally, you will have a hearty breakfast before heading out for the hunt. One hunts most of the day, so lunch is eaten out in the mountains, and upon returning, a delightful dinner with delicious French specialties and a good glass of wine is served.

On top of the hunting, this region of France is also very interesting. Here where the country is at it narrowest, it is only around 200 km to both the Atlantic Ocean and the Mediterranean Sea. There are many exciting historic towns and chateaux, for example Toulouse, the famous town of Lourdes and Pau, while the tiny country of Andorra is also close by. The wonderful food and wine of the region is well worth the trip by itself. All in all, it is a very attractive destination for the non-hunting part of the family.

The easiest way to get here is to fly to either Toulouse or Pau.

As far as mountain hunting is concerned, there are several different hunting areas in the Pyrenees. Regardless of whether it is one or the other hunting area, you hunt in a very nice mountain terrain in the Pyrenees. Here there is a very good population of chamois and mouflons, and since the hunting pressure is minimal, good trophies can also be expected, and at prices that are significantly lower than on the Spanish side of the Pyrenees.

The hunting period for chamois and mouflon is from 15 October until the end of February, and you can hunt every day of the week.

The best hunting period for chamois is from mid/late October to the end of November, which is the chamois' rutting period.

The best mouflon hunting period is during the rut, which extends from mid-November to mid-December.

Chamois

Male and female are hunted and both of them are trophy-bearing. In general, only old animals of 8 years or older are hunted. Medal trophies (bronze and silver) are shot every year.

Mouflon

Only older mouflon rams of +5 years are shot and the chance for a big mouflon ram is extremely good. Mouflon rams with horn lengths of over 80 cm are shot every year.
