Spot-and-Stalk Hunt



Overview

We collaborate with an experienced and professional outfitter offering a classic black bear hunt in Central Alberta, Canada – an area with a dense bear population and very limited hunting pressure.

The hunt takes place in North-Central Alberta, within a non-baiting zone, meaning that all hunting is conducted as spot and stalk. Bears are located and approached on foot – a challenging and authentic hunting style that demands patience and skill. The outfitter has operated sustainable hunts in this area for the past five years, and it holds a strong and healthy bear population, including brown and the rare blonde color phases.

Hunting Area

The terrain varies between forest, open oil fields, recent logging areas, and higher ridges. Hunters are transported around the area using Argo ATVs, regular ATVs, UTVs, and 4x4 vehicles, depending on terrain conditions. Hunting takes place mainly in open cut blocks and along forest and access roads, where new grass and fresh shoots attract the bears in spring.

Accommodation

The outfitter now offers lodging in his modern, fully equipped hunting lodge – a significant upgrade from the former wilderness camp. The lodge features three comfortable bedrooms, two bathrooms, and a cozy lounge area where guests can relax after the hunt.

Transport and Itinerary

The outfitter provides all transportation between Edmonton Airport and the hunting area. Hunters are picked up directly at the airport and driven to the lodge.

Depending on flight schedules, it may be necessary to spend one night at a hotel in Edmonton before and/or after the hunt (at your own expense). After the hunt, hunters are transferred back to Edmonton in time for their return flight.

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


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During the stay, hunters are accommodated at **Corbett Creek Cottage**, located in Lone Pine, Alberta – near Fort Assiniboine. The lodge serves as an ideal base for hunting expeditions in Northern Alberta, offering homely comfort in the heart of the Canadian wilderness.

The cottage is fully furnished and features a complete kitchen, three bedrooms (two hunters per room), two fully equipped bathrooms, laundry facilities, and two smaller cabins used by guides, the camp cook, or – upon request – by hunters.

The lodge includes spacious dining and lounge areas that create a **pleasant and relaxed atmosphere** after a day in the field. A dedicated **camp cook** prepares delicious home-cooked meals and fresh baking, while **fruit**, **snacks**, **and beverages** are available at all times in the common area.

Here you'll find a cozy and well-organized base combining both comfort and a genuine wilderness feel – the perfect place to relax and recharge between hunting days.









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The hunting area is located in Central Alberta, approximately 170 km north of Edmonton, and covers several thousand square kilometers. The terrain is diverse, featuring mixed forests, large open oil fields, recently logged areas, and higher elevations – a landscape ideal for spot-and-stalk hunting.

During the hunt, hunters are transported around the area using Argo ATVs, standard ATVs, UTVs, and 4x4 vehicles, depending on the terrain. Hunting mainly takes place in open logging areas, oil fields, and along old forest and access roads, where new grass and fresh shoots attract bears during spring.

Black bears are omnivorous but feed primarily on vegetation such as grass, berries, roots, and shoots. In spring, after months in hibernation, they seek additional protein by feeding on small mammals, insects, and fish.

In addition to black bears, the area offers opportunities to encounter other wildlife species such as moose, various deer species, grizzly bears, wolves, and smaller game. If you've ever dreamed of harvesting a black bear in the true Canadian





wilderness, our partner will be happy to help you make that dream come true.

- Good rubber boots or stalking boots
- Warm clothing and spare layers
- Personal toiletries and hygiene items
- Hunting gear: rifle and suitable ammunition (check local regulations)
- Hunting knife

- · Camera with extra batteries and memory cards

Climate:

In May, temperatures typically range between 0°C and 20°C (32–68°F). Weather conditions can change quickly, with cool mornings and milder afternoons, so layered, warm, and windproof clothing is recommended.
